• USDA.

- Equipment for project 2 (Wheelwright Plant) is out to bid and will just stay out until notice to proceed from USDA has occurred, which we hope to be this week.
- ➤ The Sewer Commissioners/Board of Selectmen held a special meeting Wednesday, May 3, 2023 to discuss rates and Betterments. Rates were approved for FY2024 as a uniform unit rate with addition of the bedroom unit rates to be incorporated into the sewer regulations when they are rewritten. Another public meeting has been set for
